## **WatchandWager secures key agreements with Monarch Content Management and NYRA**

*WatchandWager renews access to major racetracks and Triple Crown events*

The board of Webis, the Group specialising in pool wagering is pleased to announce that its Advanced Deposit Wagering (“ADW”) business, WatchandWager.com LLC (“WatchandWager”) renewed agreements with Monarch Content Management Group (Monarch) and the New York Racing Association (NYRA) to accept wagers on their racetracks in 2026. The agreements were signed in late 2025 and went into immediate effect.

The renewals of the agreements with Monarch and NYRA allows WatchandWager players to wager on many of the most prominent tracks in the United States. The agreement with Monarch covers 19 racetracks, including Gulfstream Park, Santa Anita Park, and the home of the Preakness Stakes, Pimlico. The agreement with NYRA gives WatchandWager players access to 17 racetracks, which includes Saratoga Race Course and the home of the Belmont Stakes, Belmont Park. In addition to these agreements, WatchandWager previously signed an agreement with Churchill Downs, Incorporated (CDI), which allows for wagering on the Kentucky Derby and all CDI-affiliated tracks. The agreements with NYRA and Monarch Content Management complement WatchandWager’s extensive international content rights, which include France, Great Britain, Ireland, South Africa, Dubai, India, South Korea, Hong Kong, Japan, Australia, and New Zealand. This combination of contracts and agreements has positioned WatchandWager as the industry leader in offering its American customers the widest range of premium horse racing of any US-based ADW.

In conjunction with these contractual agreements, WatchandWager has obtained renewals of all of its key state-by-state ADW licences for 2026. Among those individual state ADW licences are California, Colorado, Kentucky, New York, and Washington. In addition to the individual state licences, WatchandWager received a renewal of its multi-jurisdictional wagering licence from the North Dakota Racing Commission for 2026. The company currently has a two-year multi-jurisdictional wagering licence from the California Horse Racing Board which is valid through 2026.

Ed Comins, President of WatchandWager, commented:

“As we look forward to a brand new year of racing, we are pleased to have secured these strategic renewals of contracts and licences for 2026. WatchandWager takes pride in being able to offer the most racing of all the US-based ADWs, and we are excited to have the biggest events and the most

The company holds United States pari-mutuel licences for its ADW business in the US, namely a multi-jurisdictional licence issued by North Dakota and key individual licenses in California, Kentucky and New York, as well as several other US states. The business provides wagering opportunities predominantly on horse and greyhound racing and has contracted with a significant number of prestigious racetrack partners within the United States, including Churchill Downs, the New York Racing Association, and Monarch Content Management. These contracts provide WatchandWager access to the prestigious Triple Crown series (including the Kentucky Derby) and the most prominent US racetracks that feature premier racing events at the highest level of the sport. In addition to its US-based agreements, WatchandWager holds agreements with major international racing authorities*

*in Hong Kong, Canada, United Kingdom, Ireland, Australia, South Africa, and France amongst others to accept wagers from US customers on the biggest international racing events. It provides wagering facilities to customers through its website, [watchandwager.com](http://watchandwager.com), and mobile product as well as offering a Business Trading product and a telephone call centre.*
